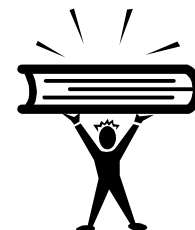

TOM DAVIS VISITS THE STONEHENGE SCHOOL



For the second time this year we have been lucky enough to have an international athlete come into school as part of the Sky Sports Living for Sport project. This project allows pupils to use sport as a way to develop skills, including co-ordination and team building skills.

Tom represents Great Britain in Judo. At a young age he participated in a wide variety of sports but it wasn't until the age of 17, encouraged by the high achievers at his local judo club, that he decided he wanted to become a black belt and go on to represent his country. He has won the commonwealth Judo Championship and the British Championship. Tom has had many injuries throughout his career but has

never let this hinder his progress. He is currently training to achieve his childhood dream to represent his country at the 2012 Olympics, and become the first British Olympic Judo Champion.

Tom's day at The Stonehenge School started with him meeting the year 7 Living for Sport group. The group, who also met with Chris Horsman before Christmas, spent the first two lessons of the day carrying on the work started with Chris. They talked more about the 6 keys to success, including his hunger to achieve his dreams. Tom spoke to the group about how he had never given up on his dream although he has been injured and how he is still determined to be at the 2012 Olympics in London as a competitor.

Throughout his talk with the group Tom also did some team building games with them, these included the human knot and a trust game. The group worked well together in all the games and got really stuck into the activities.

WILTSHIRE SCHOOLS CROSS COUNTRY CHAMPIONSHIPS RESULTS.

The Stonehenge School sent 9 runners to The Wiltshire Schools Cross Country Championships held at Grittleton House School near Chippenham on Saturday 22nd January. The nine were representing The Salisbury Area against teams from Swindon, Kennet, West Wilts and North Wilts.

The day was cold, overcast, and threatened to deliver a blast of sleet at any time. The underfoot conditions were hard due to the frost present in the ground.

The first event to feature a Stonehenge pupil was the Minor Boys where Callum Newman (who had been travel sick on the journey) tried hard, but unfortunately he had drained himself of energy, and he retired during the race to record a D.N.F.

That race was followed by the Junior Girls which featured Jasmine Bucannon and Whitney Scrase (both are year 8 girls competing against mainly year 9's), where unfortunately Whitney suffered an ankle injury during the race on the hard bumpy ground, and had to retire to record a D.N.F. but Jasmine ran well to finish 32nd.

The next race with a Stonehenge interest was the Junior Boys where 4 boys lined up to represent The Salisbury Area Team; Gio Downie, Matt Smith, Chris Hill (all of whom are year 9), and Tyler Faircloth(year 8). The boys all did very well with Gio winning the event , Matt finishing Third, Chris finishing 6th and Tyler 36th.

Gio, Matt and Chris have now been selected to represent Wiltshire in The South West Cross Country Championships to be held in Somerset on Saturday February 12th.

Tyler Brockway was our representative in the Intermediate Boys event and he ran very well in one of the longest races of the day to finish a creditable 27th in a strong field of runners.

The last event of the day was the Minor Girls and Stonehenge was represented by Claudia Downie. She ran very well to finish in 10th place to gain a place in The Wiltshire team for the South West Schools event. She will be the first girl to represent Wiltshire Schools Athletics in any event since 2003!

With four of our runners progressing to the Wiltshire team and good wholehearted performances from the other 5 , Saturday was a good day for Stonehenge School.

The Stonehenge School were also represented amongst the organisers with help from Ms Jackson, Mr Hershbein (and in his absence), Mr Hewitt sent along his Mum and Dad to help. My thanks to them and the parents who came to support their youngsters on the day.

Qualifying Benefits

Income Support/Income based Job Seekers Allowance/Income Related Employment Support Allowance/ Child Tax Credit providing your annual income is less than £16,190/Guaranteed Element of State Pension Credit/Support Under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999.

Once you have completed and signed the application form, it is then sent to County Hall, Trowbridge, who will check your eligibility. Confirmation of eligibility will be sent to you directly from County Hall. Your letter of entitlement can then be shown to the School Office who will inform the School Dining Hall of your child/children's entitlement.

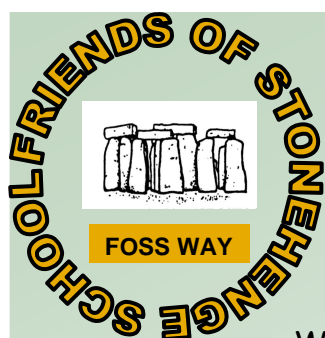
Please contact the school to reserve your free tickets to the performance.

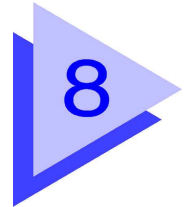
Well Done to all those pupils in the list.

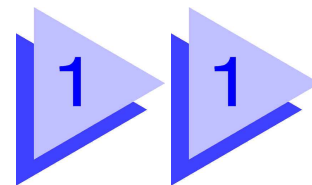

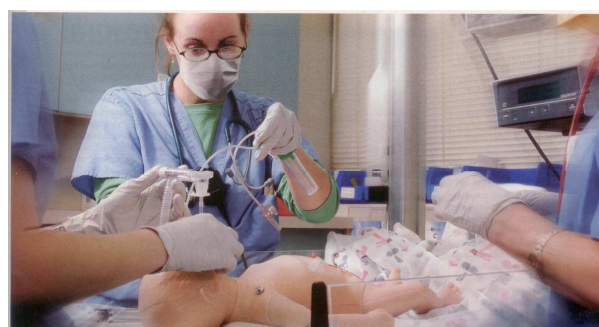

Year 11 pupils on The Aim Higher Mentoring Scheme have been busy filling in application forms for this Summer's "Uni Taster" opportunities. So far we believe that we have four Year 11 pupils aiming to spend four days and three nights away at one of the following Universities. Two girls are intending to visit Bournemouth University to study Business/Sport and Art and Design and two boys planning to visit Exeter or Bath University to study Sport. We are hopeful that a further four will get their applications in before the deadline on February 4th.

Ten pupils (8) from Year 9 and (2) from Year 8 took part in a Health and Social Care day visit to UWE Glenside campus to take part in a series of four workshops based on Science in Health and Social Care. These workshops were Mental Health Care, Midwifery, Radiography and Physiotherapy. Pupils were encouraged to take part in a practical sense where possible amongst sessions based upon discussion questions and answers. The only problem was the minibus broke down as we were about to return home.



Pupils spoke after the event about how much they enjoyed the workshops with Midwifery, because of the amount of learning and its practical nature, coming out as most popular followed by Radiography, because of the imagery presented, being a close second favourite. Two pupils were most impressed with the nature of the work revealed in the Mental Health Nursing workshop and are considering that as a possible career choice.

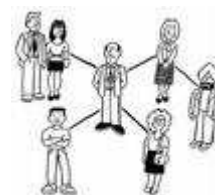

HEART SHAPED PIZZA

Ingredients

125g of strong bread flour
A pinch of salt
1 dessert spoon of oil
1 sachet of fast action dry yeast
Flour for the surface
Warm water
Heart shaped container (optional)
Your own pizza toppings

Equipment

Dessert spoon
A fork
Kettle
Baking tray
Tray
Bowl
Knife
Grater
Chopping board
Oven gloves
Tea towel

Method

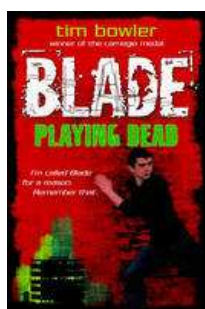
- ◆ First add 125g of strong bread flour into the bowl
- ◆ Next add a pinch of salt but make sure you don't put too much in
- ◆ Then add 1 dessert spoon of oil
- ◆ After that add 1 sachet of fast action dry yeast (if you are not allergic to yeast)
- ◆ Then stir ingredients until they are all mixed together
- ◆ Next take hand hot warm water and add a bit at a time. Make sure you stir it until it is soft and sticky
- ◆ Leave to prove (rise) somewhere warm for 10 minutes
- ◆ Next put flour on the table and put some on your hand to tip our the dough onto the table
- ◆ Then knead the dough until it is nice and smooth
- ◆ Then get your baking tray and put the dough on. When you have done that press the dough into a heart shape
- ◆ Finally you can add your chosen toppings to put on top
- ◆ When you are finished put the dough into the oven to cook for 10 minutes.

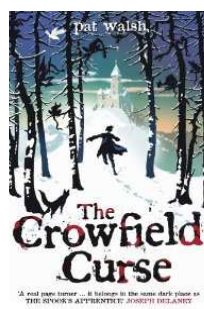
If you are allergic to yeast you can cook it with baking powder.

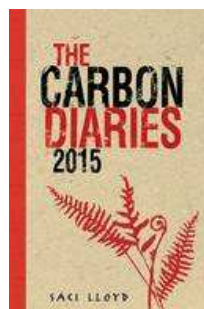

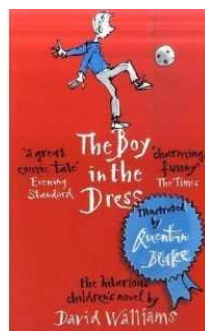

The hope is that using Drama as the method of delivery will be an effective way of learning and will help them recall the content of the performance and discussions.

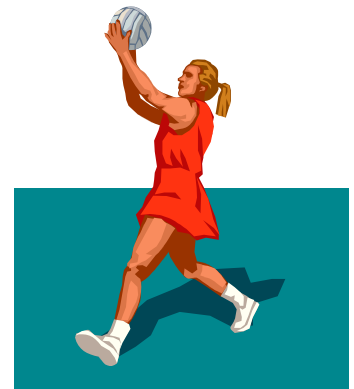
